
Hair Love

work together to create the perfect hairstyle for a special day.



As a bi-racial child who never appreciated their hair, I love how this book affirms Black children's identities and challenges the under-representation of Black families in children's books. The story also offers a powerful message about gender roles: Zuri's dad lovingly learns to care for her hair, showing that nurturing, tenderness, and competence in caregiving are not limited by gender.

Guiding Questions

- What do you think this story will be about?
- Zuri's hair is an important part of who she is. What is something interesting or important about you?
- How would the story change if Zuri had your hair?
- Zuri's daddy does so much to take care of her. Who is someone who takes care of you? What do they do that makes you feel loved?
- What do you use on your hair? Do you think it would work for Zuri's hair?
- What do you think about Zuri's dad doing her hair?
- Does anyone help you with your hair?
- Why is Zuri's hair such a big part of the story?
- Spending time on her hair is one way Zuri's family shows their love for her. What are some ways your family shows love?
- What are some ways you show who you are through your hair, clothing, or style?
- What did you enjoy most about the story?
